## What is Precious Minds?

The Precious Minds Programme provides fun sessions for Years 3 and above by raising awareness of dementia. This fun, interactive unique programme is delivered by our team using games, arts and crafts and helping children overcome their fear of dementia.

We can provide sessions to either small or large groups which can be adapted depending on age and ability and parents are also welcome to attend the workshops at school with their child.

These fun unique sessions will help them to understand what dementia is and explain the importance of children having an understanding of living with relatives with dementia and explore a variety of ways to engage with them.



### Our Aim is To:-

- Remove the fear around dementia.
- Help children to learn how to communicate and interact with a person living with dementia.
- Support children to understand the impact of making someone with dementia feel safe.
- Identify ways for schools to support the community and people living with dementia.



# Benefits of Raising Awareness of Dementia

By reducing the stress for children when they hear a relative has dementia or visiting a relative with dementia enables them to feel more confident when communicating and interacting with them.

Children can often talk to people with Dementia better than adults and the benefit of young and old communicating together can have a real impact on people with Dementia, by making them feel safe, happy and joyful - even if it's only for a short period of time.
